Whereas the Nuclear Waste Management Organization has been mandated by the
federal government to develop a strategy for the disposal of nuclear waste by November
2005

And Whereas, the burying of nuclear waste in the Canadian Shield has been
mentioned as a possible method of disposing of nuclear waste,

And Whereas, a strong possibility exists that Northeastern Ontario would be seen
as a possible host for said waste if the Canadian Shield option is chosen as the preferred
method of waste disposal,

And Whereas, the movement of nuclear waste through northern communities as

well as the disposal of waste near communities represents a threat could pose unprecedented threats to health, to persons and to the environment, as well as to the economic development of our region for up to 100,000 years into the future,

Be It Resolved That the Town of Latchford declare itself a 'nuclear waste free zone' and as such that it states it's opposition to the placement of nuclear waste within it's boundaries as well as the transportation of nuclear waste by rail or by road through any part of the Town of Latchford.

Be It Further Resolved, that this position be communicated to the Nuclear Waste management Organization.

Be It Further Resolved that the Town of Latchford undertakes to encourage other municipalities in Northern Ontario to take a similar stand on the issue.
(Resolution was carried with Councillors Suy, Chaput, MacArthur, and Humphries in favour and Councillor Bell opposed.)
