Mayor's Report, May 17, 2018

Natural Gas application

We held our conference call on April 19 with Perry, Jaime and I participating. Reviewing the criteria for evaluation of project approval determined that we were in the upper half of what is needed to be eligible to receive the service. We have received the list of municipalities that received funding and included in the list is KL Gold's Taylor Mine near Matheson which is to receive \$1.6 M to extend gas to that mine. Interestingly, that is exactly the amount required to extend the service to Latchford. First Nation communities comprised the bulk of successful applicants and there was over \$27 M going to South Bruce County area out of the total of \$74.5 M. We were encouraged to advocate both provincially and federally for an extension to this program in the hopes of getting the service to Latchford.

Xplornet Internet Service

There has been considerable email communication with both NeoNet and Xplornet with regard to the areas of town that are not getting any service from the new tower. We should add poor service to areas that have switched if my experience is any example. Following is an answer Dan Cleroux and I got from Jennifer McWilliams of Xplornet:

Hi Dan and George, I wanted to let you know that our engineering team and field operations team is actively working on a solution to signal issues in the area. Our field operation team has gone up to the tower and replaced some of the cables which is helping with signal quality. Our engineering team is reconfigured some of the network settings and we are already seeing better results. We have been able to install some customers on the Murphy Hill Road, but are working to solve the issues with Robert MacArthur situation and yourself Dan. Our initial research, it appears the trees in the area are causing a bit of interference. We feel the solution may be simple one but are going to work with the installers to provide a solution. I wanted to let you both know we are committed to providing service in the area and I will update you as we make more progress on the situation.

ONTC Land Acquisition.

Montreal River Water Management Plan

I was provided the name "Ted Gruetzner" as the best individual at OPG to pursue the implementation of WMP and am pursuing that route for now. As he is at the Vice President level with OPG, I am having difficulty getting his contact information but will persevere.

Tri Origin Exploration

Tri Origin is presently core logging on the arena floor and based on a company announcement, they will be drilling until the end of June, a total of 4,850 metres in 5 drill holes. Uncertain as to when the logging will conclude. My understanding is that they are presently employing a local resident in the core logging activity.

House of Memories Museum and Ontario Loggers Hall of Fame Society

I have prepared draft By-Laws, Constitution and Meeting Agenda to create a. n Ontario Historical Society affiliation for both which establishes the non-profit status which in turn allows fund raising initiatives presently inaccessible. I have shared those drafts with Rob Leverty of the OHS for comment and should be able to hold an inaugural meeting within a month.

Cobalt Metals Tech

Cobalt Metals Tech open house last night was quite well attended with approximately 30 people out. During a presentation from David Riekie and Cherie Leeden they stressed a commitment to support the communities that they are active in.

New Ontario Pellet Heat Alliance

I have been invited to a forum on the utilization of wood pellets as a heat source and found there was actually a program out that would have fully funded the conversion of heating our water treatment plant to wood pellets. Unfortunately that program ended on May 11 and we were not made aware of it. it was only available to municipalities that did not have natural gas services.
