# Mayor's Report, September 24, 2019

# **LVFD Derailment Material Recovery**

As the LVFD wrap up their recovery and disposing/sale of material from April 01 derailment I think it appropriate for Council to extend our sincere appreciation to Fire Chief Mike Beaupre, volunteers from his department and members of the community at large, for the effort put forward. The work ethic demonstrated at this community building exercise resulted in the LVFD raising over \$72,000 (at last count) of funds and swapping materials with Sunday Creek Metals of Charlton for more than \$5,000 of metal roofing for the addition to their fire hall. I have been witness to many efforts in Latchford over my more than a few years in politics but none equals this one. I have been notified by the ONR that they will begin removing the scrap metal on September 30 which I have relayed to Mike and others. I will be presenting a motion to express the appreciation of all of us and the community as well.

### **Natural Gas**

I met with John Vanthof and Darlene Bowman on August 23 to discuss establishing contact with the Ministry of Energy, Northern Development and Mines and Indigenous Affairs. The intent was to identify the primary contacts within that Ministry so that we can develop a strategy to make formal application for the extension of natural gas services to Latchford under Bill 32. While that meeting went well and was worthwhile, a better meeting took place on September 16 when Councillor Green dragged me to North Bay to interact with the Conservative caucus on their way to the International Plowing Match in Verner. Jay Aspin introduced me Greg Rickford, Minister of Energy, Northern Development and Mines and Indigenous Affairs and I queried him as to how Latchford can get into the queue for natural gas services. The exchange went well and he did make a few notes but the trip became very worthwhile when Minister of Government Services, Bill Walker, came over to speak to us. I briefed him on my meeting with Greg Rickford and he announced he was the #2 guy on that file as he had just been named Associate Minister of Energy to lessen some of Rickford's load. I emailed him yesterday requesting contact information which was promptly responded to by his Director of Communication this morning. It was a very positive exchange with Minister Walker as was one with Minister of Municipal Affairs Steve Clark that Scott introduced me to.

# **ONTC Communication**

Rebecca McGlynn did get back to me but not until after the TeMAG meeting on August 24. She assured me that they do intend to have that conference call with Temiskaming Mayors and Reeves which they had alluded to in our June call. Still nothing more!

## Fishing Issue at the Latchford Dam

I was advised on September 05 that an OPP officer had kicked three local residents off the dam and told them they couldn't fish from it. The following morning I called PSPC to enquire if any changes had been made with respect to access to the dam. I was assured there was none and

the first people that such a change would be discussed with would be the Town. I then drove up to the station to hopefully, contact Const Peter Taylor to share the message and met with Const Martin Thibault. After a series of phone calls and emails the matter has been resolved. I have a scheduled phone call with PSPC this Thursday morning and we will further discuss the signage at the Dam.
