Mayor's Report, May 14, 2020

### Spring Freshet/Dam Operation

As predicted in my last report, we had a very gentle run off to the extent that PSPC are scrambling to get the Lake up to summer level for this Saturday. I have been responding to concerns brought to me by waterfront residents and others regarding low water levels and the impact on certain species of fish. For instance, while their operations focus on maintaining a flow over the pickerel spawning areas, they disregard the impacts of their operations on the Pike spawn in Bay Lake itself. I think that PSPC will get their eyes opened with respect to their responsibilities to those who live by and use Bay Lake with implementation of the Montreal River Water Management Plan later this year. Non compliance with the plan has to be responded to during the Standing Advisory Committee meetings and they will be held accountable.

### **Natural Gas Update**

Included in your package is a letter I received from Associate Minister of Energy Bill Walker in response to the lobbying effort I had made in support of our application to Enbridge Gas. The composition of the letter tells me the Minister or senior staff would have read my letter which buoys me. I followed that up with a phone call to Wendy Landry, Senior Advisor, Indigenous, Municipal and Stakeholder Relations for Enbridge and she remains supportive and encouraging. The response I got back from Fedeli's office advised that the Minister did not intervene in OEB submissions but I countered that the effort was intended to keep him informed.

### **Upgrades to Water Pollution Control Plant Disinfection System**

I participated in an Ontario Good Roads Association webinar regarding post Covid stimulus funding with the intent of identifying funding to assist with this project. Not a lot of solid potential here at this point but any project applied for has to be included in your asset management plan when it opens and Jaime said this fits ours. The term "shovel ready" was emphasized but a few participants stressed "shovel worthy" as being of equal importance and ours sure fits that category as it has been legislated as required. I think "shovel worthy" could become the new "buzz word" in this round. Francine and I participated in a webinar featuring Infrastructure Minister Melanie Joly where we hoped to identify funding for this project. Despite Francine's determined efforts we were unable to get an answer to the question we posed but were advised that we would receive a written response.
