Mayor's Report, September 15, 2020

#### **Dam Operation**

While I was unsuccessful in contacting Eric Potvin relative to the dam operation (I forgot!) I did have to deal with a dam issue when a local resident contacted me on August 24 and presented me with a \$65 ticker he had been issued by an OPP officer for fishing from the dam. I drove the ticket to New Liskeard where I again explained that fishing from the dam was legal with the exception of spawning season. This time it was the MNR sign that confused the officer and I will advise Pete Gilboe and hopefully he has contacts that can get the hand modified sign replaced. I did note that PSPC still had not corrected their sign so contacted Helene Belanger who is to follow up on that.

#### Hydro One Clean-up - Murphy Mill Road

After Jaime had not received an acknowledgement or answer to his letter and as you can't phone into the office, I drove to New Liskeard in the hope of speaking to someone. They have removed the visitor's parking signs, the door was locked and no phone number provided for contact. On my way back, I encountered a line clearing crew south of Cobalt and stopped and spoke with them which was followed up by a visit from a foreman and the areas that had been indicated to me and shared with the foreman were cleaned up. Of note, the foreman encouraged using the 800 number on our hydro bills to convey any issues to hydro as they will be forwarded to the responsible section for action.

#### **Pike/Whitney Lake Logging Activity**

I was alerted to a road being constructed on the west side of Highway 11 between Whitney and Pike Lake and as that is Latchford, I went to check it out. The MNRF are not as considerate of authorizing activities within municipal boundaries as MNDM are and it turned out to be a logging road being built by an area contractor.

#### **TVO** project

Including the Moose Call on the Town's webpage has resulted in a strange request. A young man who works for TVO reads it and has been communicating with me about putting together a podcast (I believe) about our little community effort. He seems much taken by this 32 year old community newsletter and wants to interview different people associated with it.
