The remainder of October will be used to prepare the town for winter. Eg flags off poles, camp ground winterized, flower boxes and garden cleaned up, sander and plow installed on truck.

I am awaiting a response from Helene Belanger with regards to a clearer message being posted on the PSPC signs at the dam that was promised last year.

Temiskaming Municipal Services Association

I attended the TMSA Annual General Meeting on September 17 and found it both interesting and beneficial. Chief Building Inspector Dave Barton made an excellent presentation on the steps required to be taken to declare a building unfit for occupancy and the process to follow in order to have it demolished. He supported his presentation with photos of different examples that he has dealt with which underlined why this process can become necessary. It all was well worth the trip to Earlton.
