## **Rec Centre**

Replaced scress on new section with oversized screws approx. 5 years ago .Main roof was fine at the time. Time to inspect again.no leaks at this point.

Outside lights have been changed to LED. Inside light changeover waiting on possible funding program.

New fridge for kitchen.

Floor in main hall is looking poorly. Consider professional cleaning again or replacement in the future.

Geothermal heating / cooling there is no one to service this system in the area. I have reached out to companies in North Bay and no response.

## **Town Shop / Equipment**

#### Main shop

Far bay roof leaks down the wall from ice dam in the winter.

Metal roof needs to be inspected and screws changed / tightened if required.

New door seals on Bay doors.

Possibly more insulation in attic and walls.

Upgrade heating.

Paint building as required.

#### Sand shed/Cold storage

North wall has pushed out from weight if sand.

Shed may become to small as our winters change.

We may require straight salt one day.

#### **Equipment**

Town truck, it's a dodge! electrical issues tire sensors gone power door locks and windows not reliable. Body is starting to rust out.

Backhoe is in great shape

Plow truck has some surface rust on the frame. Wiring harness issues with headlights at times. Hydraulic lines and fittings showing their age.

Plows have normal wear and tear.

Sweeper I cant believe its still running!!

Lawn mower great condition

Probably need to purchase a new wiper snipper next year.

## **Water Plant**

Minor roof leak in chemical room repaired. Entire roof should be professionally inspected.

Metal stricture looks solid.

Infrastructure is well maintained and upgraded as required.

All building lights already switched to LED.

Windows are shot! Time to replace them.

Possible issues due to age is the intake pipe and crib and the clear wells that hold the drinking water.

Water and sewer infrastructure is getting older, expect more repairs and leaks as the system ages.

## **Town Office**

Needs a new roof.

Needs eavestroughs.

The brick at the front is almost done, the brick is disintegrating underneath .

Do we reseal basement wall before repairing the entrance brick?

Furnace is electric and does not work at full capacity. Service guys cant figure it out.

Air conditioning is also old.

Windows are new.

Basement wall has been repaired and smell is gone. Its now usable again.

## Fred Keenan building

Cory Block repaired back wall of library, he built out the vents, installed a drip edge on roof, reflashed brick wall ledge, repaired the siding and repaired all the water damage inside and out.

Front of building is fine the new eavestroughs have kept water from walls.

Brick has deteriorated in spots. Parged the bad areas a few years back and seems to be working fine. The brick mortar in spots has fallen out. I have replaced with mortar calking as required. Outside of building is getting old.

New entrance ramp a few years ago.

Roof shingles still look good.

Interior light changeover waiting on grant opportunity.

Exterior lights LED except one. Will change out shortly.

Heat is electric baseboard. Upgrade required.

Air conditioner is old and past its prime, already acting up this year. Seems I have to call someone in twice a summer to fix it.

## Fire Hall

New section needs paint and ventilation system.

Old section needs a bathroom overhaul, paint job, new door seals.

More insulation in attic.

Change lights to LED.

Furnace is Oil

### **Recreation**

Beach house is in good condition. Roof is approx. 7 years old and structure is solid.

Metal boat storage building has some bumps and bruises but is sufficient for what its used for'

Beach park is in good condition. Concrete in pavilion has cracked and heaved, may consider replacing the pad one day.

Docks and boat launch have recently been refurbished and are in excellent condition.

Playground equipment is solid.

Time to start replacing picnic tabled with metal framed ones. Working on a price.

Ball diamond bleachers in poor condition. Will need to repair or take down in the near future.

Veterns park pavilion needs stain and a new roof.

Boardwalk is ok replacing boards as required. Taking down danger poplar trees as required.

Brick walkway needs a plan and a lot of TLC.

Creek boardwalk bridge needs replacing soon. We already have the beams in stock.

We replace boards as required but eventually we will need to replace the beams.
