Public Works Report November 2023

Hi everyone,

All ready for winter. Had to install a new drive chain on the sander. It works perfectly now! I wish I would have done that 2 years ago!

Cemetery is brushed out. I will burn the brush pile there shortly.

New council chambers will be ready for your November meeting.

Early December I have a winter maintenance trainer coming in to give us a training presentation. He is a friend of a Murphy mill resident and what goes around comes around and there will be no charge. If anyone is interested in sitting in on the training let me know. I will have a firm date shortly.

I am plugging away at painting the post office area. I have the doors left to do but I'm using it as filler work so it might take a little time to complete. The more I paint the more I realize the entire building needs sprucing up.

If anyone has any colour ideas please bring them forward.

Not sure what Pat can do with his back. It changes from day to day. But he is doing physiotherapy so fingers crossed for a speedy recovery. If there is money in the public works budget to paint more of the building I could use some council volunteers!

Carpet one has came in and assessed the rec centre floors. The office has the pricing and options. Bottom line industrial tiles need regular maintenance! And by regular I mean at least twice a year. It wasn't kept up because of the cost and now we are going to Pay!! The tiles in the main hall that are bubbling is due to concrete effervescence. The tiles will have to come up and a special solution applied and then retiled. This should be done at the very least. People continue to comment on how bad the floor looks. It's awfully hard to rent out a space that looks like a crack shack.

The LED lighting program has started. Some lights in the office and the medical centre have been changed over. I haven't received a timeline for the other building yet. The arena may have to wait until spring to be completed.

Pedersen had a Dozer at the dump for the UV project. The operator didn't like sitting still so I put him to work! The dump bank has been covered and packed down. And the soil piles for future capping have been stock piled.

Town truck will have body work to it next week. It was unable to pass a safety due to rocker guard holes and front fenders.

Wyatt said the truck is mechanically sound for a dodge but I need to fix up the body a bit. I have ordered fenders and a rocker panel/ cab corner repair package. By the time Chris and I are done it will be around \$1000.00

Waiting on a Quote from the Amish and Brodie for the town office roof. We have a few quotes already in. The price will not be guaranteed for the spring but it will give us a number to budget with.

The veterans park roof is completed. Thanks to Brodie for helping out .

Christmas lights will be up and ready for December 1st tree lighting.

Arena pad is washed and ready, I will try and make ice over Christmas to be ready for the new year.
