#### Mayor's Report, May 16, 2019

#### **PSPC Communication and water issues**

While there have been some rather tense moments with regard to raising water levels, unless we get inundated with rain, we have passed the high points of spring freshet according to all reports. I do believe that water levels exceeded what was reached in 2013 but remained a far cry from 1960. As it is apparent that it is the responsibility of a municipality to provide sand bags to its residents, the decision was made to acquire an additional 2,000 sand bags bringing our inventory to 2,500. Fortunately, none of them have had to be used at this point but it does provide some comfort to those who might need them.

The contractor that installed the safety buoy at the dam will be back to replace it as it has been destroyed during freshet. My next call with Judith Bennett and John Ikonomopoulos is scheduled for May 29 at which time I should be getting confirming information about the dam plaque unveilings.

#### **Union Gas**

Glen Huard of Union Gas responded to my enquiry about using ICIP funding for natural gas expansion into Latchford. His contact advised that: "the ICIP is mainly geared towards initiatives for new buildings and roads not for natural gas expansion per say. Referring to the MOI site the funding is available across five priority infrastructure streams: public transit, green, social, trade and transportation, and rural and northern communities' infrastructure. From past delivered funds most of the investments were in the new building & housing sector and social programs." I think the best way forward is to identify an individual at the Ministry of Infrastructure that we could discuss with and lobby for the inclusion of natural gas expansion as an essential infrastructure component for Latchford.

#### **Montreal River Water Management Plan Implementation**

At the TeMAG meeting of Saturday past, I managed to get a resolution of support for the implementation of this plan that will be forwarded to the OPG. Further, it is on the agenda for our next TMA meeting on May 30 for the support of that body. I feel it is imperative that we push this issue hard at this point having just come through a high freshet where communications were vital and very good which supports the implementation of the MRWMP as it ensures a high level of communication on an as needed and year round basis.

#### **Derailment Building Materials**

Despite ongoing communications with John Corley of the ONTC about the salvage of this material, I keep getting his "hopes" that the legal will release it next week! I did mention that "legal" appears to have no appreciation of what exposure to the elements can do, especially to OSB, and the other materials. I pointed out, and he was aware, that many are sneaking in off the pipeline and alongside the railway to scavenge product. He stated, as late as last Friday, that Coleman Township were of the opinion that the derailment was in that township and I have attempted to clarify that with their office.
