

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LATCHFORD

BY-LAW # 2015-003

BEING a By-law to provide tax relief for the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 629

WHEREAS Section 6.1 (2) of the Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990. c.A.31 permits municipalities to pass by-laws exempting land used and occupied as a memorial home, clubhouse or athletic grounds by persons who served in the armed forces of His or Her Majesty or an ally of His or Her Majesty in any war from taxation.;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF LATCHFORD HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT 100% of the municipal portion of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 629 taxes be written off for the years 2015-2018.
2. THAT this By-law comes into force and effect on the day of passing thereof.
3. THAT all other By-laws and resolutions, or parts thereto, contrary hereto or inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

THE HISTORY OF THE
